Minutes – July 7, 2009
Tom and Barb Hicks Fish Fry/Hangar on Sky Ranch

Meeting called to order @ 7:00 by President Dave Schmeackle.

Members and Board present: David Schmeackle, Ry Keller and Dennis Lacy, and Barb Hicks; approximately 56 members and guests attended.

Introductions went round the tables, aircraft one flies and any projects in the works. The meeting begins with a reminder that minutes are on the web site. A motion is made to approve the minutes as they appear there, and is seconded.

Treasurers Report: Ry told us the treasury contains \$1,880.00 including \$600.00 for the Colby Scholarship Fund. Tonight's split the pot is not in that figure.

Old Business:
